HAVE WE CHANGED GODS?

"Has a nation changed its gods, which are not gods? But my people have changed their Glory for what does not profit." (Jer. 2:11)

Jeremiah is often described as "The Weeping Prophet" for good reasons. His writings reflect the troubled heart of a godly man. He saw the moral pollution of his beloved homeland as she had "affairs" with numerous "lovers" (Jer. 30:14). He pleaded for a return to "the old paths wherein is the good way" (Jer. 6:16).

As he surveyed the chaos and ruin of his beloved Jerusalem, he imploringly cried out, "Is it nothing to you, all you who pass by?" (Lam. 1:12) Lamentations could be called a "Funeral Dirge" for the city of Jerusalem and the nation of Israel.

Jeremiah's powerful appeals remind us of the lament of the Lord Himself several centuries later: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing!" (Matt. 23:37, NKJ)

When a nation, a city, a people, or a person departs from God and His righteousness sin moves in and takes over. Therefore, they are ripe for ruin. Their sins will lead to self-destruction. Lives are left in shambles. Homes and families, the "bedrock" of society, crumble and collapse. The wise words of a wise man still ring true: "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people" (Prov. 14:34). Sin has a subtle, but sure way of "finding out" its practitioners (Num. 32:23).

Has this nation changed its gods? It is obvious that many have turned from the true God to "gods" which are not "gods" at all. Studies reveal a decline in the number of people who actually, truly believe in God. Atheism is on the rise. This should come as no surprise because the educational system has been promoting and "preaching" secularism and moral relevance for several decades. "Practical" atheism, which feigns belief in God but behaves as if He does not exist, is also very prevalent.

Pride, pleasure, power, and promiscuity are all "worshipped" by multitudes. Morality is disdained by those bent on fulfilling their every sensual and sexual desire. The evils of the Roman Empire are well documented by secular historians as well as inspired writers (See Rom. 1:25-32; 1 Cor. 6:9-11; Gal. 5:19-21). It's immorality, sexual and otherwise, ate away at it's foundation leading to its collapse "and great was its fall" (See Matt. 7:27). There is hope: "'Return unto me, and I will return to you', says the Lord of hosts" (Malachi 3:7). Edward L Anderson
